Registrants must pay a non-refundable fee of \$100 and be able to attend all sessions of the IP course and must attend the entire student teaching course, which includes a weeknight. Student teaching will be held at sites determined by class and participant demographics. New instructors have an opportunity to earn \$26 per hour.
