State EMS Board's Position on I.C.E.



I.C.E. is an acronym for In Case of Emergency. The concept is to store emergency contact information in personal cell phones using the acronym I.C.E. At the time of an emergency the hope is that EMS, police or hospital personnel can find emergency contact information by looking under I.C.E. in the victim's cell phone.

The State EMS Board takes the position that anything that aids or supplements communications and information exchange during an emergency or crisis is a good idea. It should supplement, not replace, emergency contact information in a purse or wallet so that there is more than one place to look, realizing that belongings can be scattered at an emergency scene.

EMS will always be treating the patient first at the scene. It is recommended, if a cell phone is observed with the patient, to attempt to attach the phone with the patient's belongings that will be transported if it is not feasible for EMS to make the call from ICE. The board has no plans to require EMS providers to routinely call I.C.E. numbers from the scene.

EMS Data Center

In an age of increasing concerns over issues of security and privacy of personal information, it is fair to ask the question "Is the data I send to the EMS Data Center safe and secure?" The short answer is, "Yes." The detailed explanation follows.

There are three places where the security of electronically transmitted data can be compromised: your computer, on phone lines during transmission, and our database.

When you send data to the EMS Data Center, it is done via a connection that is secured using Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) with 128-bit encryption. Data encryption "scrambles" the information sent over the Internet so that it can be read only by the computer for which it is intended. In the unlikely event that a hacker intercepts the data, that person will be unable to read it.

Once your data is received and stored in our database, the Department of Public Safety goes to great lengths to keep the data secure. Our network has been certified by the International Computer Security Association and meets their stringent standards for vulnerability testing. We use a double firewall system which greatly improves our ability to locate and block non-trusted devices. Accessing a secure server inside the second firewall requires special coding and access is restricted to a single server. Our Information Technology division has a Network Security Group which meets weekly to review changes and new services to assure that the network remains secure. They also make sure all servers, routers, firewalls, software and operating systems are maintained with the most current and/or safest release possible.

Viewing of the data from within Public Safety is limited to those with a need to know, and all employees have signed data security agreements as a condition of employment. All public records requests which ask for data from the EMS Data Center are reviewed in order to ensure the data, if released, would not tend to reveal confidential medical information. If it does, we will refuse the request.

The place where the EMS Data Center cannot protect stored information is the computer of the agency that collects the data. It is up to each agency to provide its own security. Remember these tips:

- > Protect your password.
- > Do not allow file sharing.
- > Install anti-virus software and anti-spyware software and keep them updated.

Two of the leading anti-virus programs - Norton AntiVirus and McAfee VirusScan - can be purchased in any computer store or online (www.symantec.com or www.mcafee.com, respectively). Spybot Search & Destroy is a leading anti-spyware program that is free. You can get it from www.download.com.

The Columbus Heartmobile Project 1969

Late in the decade of the 1960s, as America was fascinated by manned space flight and the race to the moon, another innovation was quietly being developed in Columbus, Ohio. Led by Dr. James V. Warren, a small group of physicians and various members from the health sector initiated the Heartmobile Project, the first vehicle of its kind in the U.S. specifically designed to transport medical care directly to the patient.

By April 1969, the project was implemented into the existing Columbus Division of Fire's emergency medical care system. It operated as a joint effort between the Columbus Division of Fire and the Ohio State University Medical Center (OSUMC).

Initially, the vehicle was located in a small, temporary building that was erected on the campus of the OSUMC directly adjacent to the Emergency Department. This building later

became known as the "Heart Shack." When a call for assistance was thought to be cardiac in nature, a physician was paged from the 11th floor Coronary Care Unit. Three firefighters and the physician would then respond in the Heartmobile.

By 1971, firefighters could be trained to operate without a physician present and eventually, the Columbus Division of Fire managed Heartmobile operations. Firefighters began treating patients at emergency scenes without direct physician supervision. A new class of health care provider was born—the paramedic.

Dr. Warren's project provided significant stimulus for development of the pre-hospital advanced medical care now provided by EMS in America.

Today, the vehicle is owned by the Central Ohio Fire Museum in Columbus. There is a movement by some original



Heartmobile physicians, paramedics and other interested parties to restore it to its 1969 configuration.

Plans for the relic include using it to promote public awareness of CPR, early defibrillation and other health issues.
