


LAW ENFORCEMENT RESOURCE PORTAL



The Law Enforcement Resource Portal (LERP) is a tool for law enforcement agencies to access additional essential resources in the event of a domestic terror attack, major disaster, emergency, or preparing for a special event.



What do you get?

The Law Enforcement Resource Portal (LERP) provides easy access to seven pre-defined law enforcement resources to aid your organization in locating needed assets in times of emergency or for event planning. These categories include; personnel, standard vehicles, specialized vehicles, aircraft, specialized teams, watercraft and equipment.

Why does it matter to you?

LERP is free of charge and is available 24/7/365. You have the ability to locate additional assets from participating law enforcement agencies from across the state, simply by accessing LERP with an internet connected device. You are also able to list resources that your agency could provide to assist other officers in a time of need.

How do you get access?

Resources can be accessed and updated through the Ohio Homeland Security Communication and Information Management System (CIMS), in the left menu, under the LERP tab.

All resources are searchable by multiple methods, including; by type, by region, by county, by agency or by distance. Simply select the desired resource and use the provided information to contact the appropriate agency and request usage of the particular asset.
